insecure population to be households with income below 200\% of Federal Poverty Level ( $\$ 60 \mathrm{~K} / \mathrm{y}$ ear for a family of 4). Rese indicates this to be a conservative estimate of the population needing food assistance to obtain adequate daily nutrition.
