What is "nutrition insecurity"?

"Nutrition insecurity" is not having reliable access to 3 healthy meals a day. San Diego Hunger Coalition estimates the nutrition insecure population to be households with income below 200% of Federal Poverty Level (\$60K/year for a family of 4). Research indicates this to be a conservative estimate of the population needing food assistance to obtain adequate daily nutrition.



Hunger Free San Diego calculates the CalFresh participation rates based on the likely eligible population with income below 185% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL), In California, households with income up to 200% FPL are encouraged to apply.
